



## Bernardine Shampo

May 8, 1946 - January 16, 2021

PRINCETON - “The song is ended, but the melody lingers on...” (Irving Berlin)  
Bernardine Carol Blankenship Shampo, nee Thomas of Princeton, WV, our beloved mother, grandmother, abuela, great grandmother, and sister after a long illness entered eternal rest on a wintery snowy afternoon at her home surrounded by loved ones on Saturday, January 16, 2021.

Born on May 8, 1946 at her maternal grandparents' home in Kegley, West Virginia the eldest child of the late Bernard A. Thomas Sr. and late G. Estelle Thomas Kirk, nee Harrison. Bernardine married her childhood sweetheart the late Daniel J. Blankenship Sr. Shortly after marrying they began their new life in Brandywine, MD. Tragedy struck a few years later leaving Bernardine a young widow with two young sons, Jack and Michael with a third son Kevin on the way. Her second marriage ending in divorce produced two additional beautiful children James and Stacey. Being widowed young gave her strength and perseverance and cemented the importance of strong family unity. Deciding to return to West Virginia to raise her five children and further her education she faced a cancer diagnosis in her late 20's. Bernardine went on to become a nurse in Labor and Delivery at Princeton Community Hospital, retiring in 2011 after 28 years of service. Happily, she saw many of the babies she cared for grow into adulthood and on to having their own babies. An extraordinary cook and a gifted and talented seamstress Bernardine learned to sew, crochet, knit and quilt as a young girl from her mother. Bernardine

really enjoyed teaching and passing on her passion for such handiwork to her daughter and granddaughters. She enjoyed sewing her own scrubs and even those of her coworkers. She even made most of the Barbie and Ken doll clothing for a younger sister and her only daughter. Upon retirement Bernardine continued to use her sewing skills to help her dear friend Kim Hicks owner of Scrubs & More ready uniforms for nursing students from Mercer, McDowell and Summers counties. Bernardine happily made many memories with her children and grandchildren on family vacations to the beaches of South Carolina, Florida and Costa Rica. Another passion was her furry family and exotic bird family. She rescued many over the years providing for care and finding forever homes for abandoned and feral felines.

Bernardine was preceded in death by her husband Danny; mother and stepfather Estelle Thomas Kirk and Robert Kirk, father Bernard Thomas Sr., and brother Bernard 'Sonny' Thomas Jr., her maternal grandparents Luther Harrison and Gladys Harrison Burgess, step grandfather Cecil Burgess, paternal grandparents Nathan and Mae Thomas.

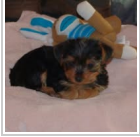

“ My dear beautiful sister. Deenie, our bond is strong and runs deeply. I will miss you immensely. You were close to 12 yrs. old when I was born. You were my protector; you nurtured and mothered me when I was young and became a best friend as I grew into adulthood. You took a lot on your shoulders as a young girl when mom had to go to work to provide for herself and her 4 children. As a young teen you kept the house clean, cooked meals, sewed clothing, bathed and yes even disciplined us. Mom didn't have to worry about us being safe & well cared for-she left us in very dependable & loving hands-yours. I was very attached to you and was in love with Danny. So attached that mom often said there were 2 reasons she moved Sonny, Elaine & me to MD when I was 3 yrs. old. First it was a safe haven for her to raise us but she said mostly because I was devastated when you & Danny moved to MD.

Sam & I moved to WV from Colorado to be closer to mom & Paula's family in MD and to be close to our WV family. Our daughter Lissa said God sent me back to WV because He had other plans for you. Your remaining time on earth was to be short as was our mom's.

The miles that separated us melted away and we reconnected. We spent time together over coffee reminiscing and bringing each other current. We both shared our great love for our furry and feathered family members with one another. You answered questions I had about memories from my toddler years. They were real...the good and the not so good. The not so good--you comforted and calmed my fears making me feel safe. The good were many--you wrapping your arms around me, laying on our shared bed comforting me after my little fingers got caught in the rollers of the wringer washer.

Lifting me up, placing me in an apple tree to pluck green un-ripened apples. My favorite to eat with salt. Later in MD this habit of climbing apple trees would get me in trouble with you. The boys & I would sit underneath the tree with your salt shaker eating the green sour apples. Eating corn on the cob while dangling our legs off the side of the porch. And yes, we had a goat. Bittersweet memories from Clinton, MD with you and Danny before his life was cut short with Leukemia. I spent my summer vacations and every school break with you before and after his passing. Your boys, my nephews were

*more like my younger brothers. We played outdoors and got dirty together. You'd pick me placing me on the washing machine so you could scrub my feet clean. Something you'd tease me about years later because I didn't like getting dirty. You'd scape together a dollar, pile the 3 boys in their oversized baby carriage and we'd walk what seemed a great distance to cross the highway to buy a dozen hamburgers. Good and lovely memories.*

*When I was 12 you remarried and soon after moved away to Massachusetts, then on to California and Arizona. The night you all dropped by to say goodbye I bawled like a baby. But we then became pen pals to stay in touch. When you returned to WV to raise your children, mom, Paula and I would drive 'down' every 3 day holiday to 'visit'. More fun & lovely memories made with you all. Bernardine, I'm so very happy for these last 2 yrs. Sam & I were able to go out for dinners with you & Stacey and some family gatherings with you at Darla & Kevin's. We made the most of our one on one time together as sisters, whether over coffee at your kitchen table, going for our monthly girls day out at the hair salon with lunch afterwards or sneaking a twist ice cream cone instead. Bernardine, I will forever carry all the memories with me - the not so happy, the sad but most of all the happy lovely memories. I love you and will carry you in my heart and thoughts until we meet up in heaven. oox, Debbie (a/k/a Squirt & Runt)*

It was uncanny how she was right over 90% of the time. 😊 Then she would say I'll be sewing a blanket soon & I know all her grandkids got one. She loved her family so much & I admired her so much. With 5 children she continued her education & became one of the best nurses I worked with. When a neurological disease disabled me from nursing she said she wanted to take me to Duke & she did for many years! We never ran out of things to talk about and we laughed & said if we ever had to go to a “home” it'd be in FL, beach view with all young male nurses! That they'd say we were old & didn't realize we pinched them or say can you pick up my glasses? Haha. I remember I had a kitten & she babysat her for me. But I'm upset I can't come in & say I'll see you later. One thing I know is that neither of us wanted to lose our independence. We talked about it a lot. I'm so sad you're gone but I'm happy you're not in pain & you can walk without every step hurting. I love you and feel so blessed to have had you as my friend❤️❤️
