PRINCETON – Conrad Jenkins, 86, of Princeton died Monday, December 3, 2018. Born May 30, 1932 at Springton he was the son of the late Mert Jenkins and Vernia Karnes Jenkins.

Conrad was a U. S. Army veteran having served in Korea, 3rd Division, 7th Regiment, Second Battalion 1950-1952. He was a member of Lashmeet Freewill Baptist Church and was retired from Coca Cola after 30 years where he was a machine service man. He was a well-known area artist and was proud of his Native American ancestry and enjoyed making moccasins and Indian jewelry.
