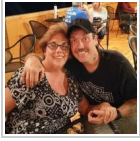
In addition to his father, he was preceded in death by his maternal grandparents, Charles and Helen McVey Crews as well as his paternal grandparents.

“ *Jeremy was the first person of differing abilities that I had ever gotten a chance to work with in a support capacity. He was the Chair of the Accessibility Committee on campus when I first started to work at BSC. My boss at the time, was the Interim VP for Student Affairs, and was charged with organizing and overseeing the committee, but was also a natural advocate as her sister had need of special assistance in certain circumstances. Jeremy was so knowledgeable and passionate about accessibility on campus that he naturally got me in his corner, and interested in possible solutions to issues that some may face. I am forever grateful for that experience because 4 years I suffered a spinal cord injury and was faced with some similar issues (not severe enough to make me confined to a wheelchair, but have used one in the past, could use one in certain circumstances now, and am deteriorating as I type, so will probably get there soon).
