PRINCETON – Kenneth Edward McCormick, 82, of Princeton, died Sunday, October 20, 2013 at Princeton Community Hospital. Born January 6, 1931 at Jenkinjones, he was the son of the late Fletcher McCormick and Mary Elizabeth Smith McCormick.

Mr. McCormick was a member of the Kee Street United Methodist Church in Princeton. He was a graduate of Beaver High School in Bluefield. He served in the US Army during the Korean Conflict. He retired from EIMCO, formerly Coppinger Machinery Service, in Bluefield where he was a welder for 32 years. He was a fan of WVU football and enjoyed bowling, golf and fishing. He was the last surviving member of his immediate family.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by five sisters, Janice McCormick, Helen Goodman, Ruth Dalton, Opal Hamro and Betty O'Bryan; and five brothers, Gail McCormick, Dwight McCormick, Marvin McCormick, Jackie McCormick and Curtis McCormick.
