BLUEFIELD – Mark Bailey, 89, of Bluefield, went to be with his Lord and Savior Monday, February 11, 2013 at Bluefield Regional Medical Center. Born January 19, 1924 at Panther, he was the son of the late Patterson Bailey and Nancy Bailey.

Mr. Bailey was a member of the Sweet Home Baptist Church in Princeton and attended the First Church of God in Princeton.
