PRINCETON— Marvin Fred Cline, 95, of Princeton died Sunday, December 30, 2012 At Carilion Roanoke Memorial Hospital in Roanoke, VA. Born August 23, 1917 in Marion, VA he was the son of the late Fred King Cline and Myrtle Mae Gross Cline.
