PRINCETON – Theodore Milton Bones, Jr., 88, of Princeton, died Friday, October 22, 2010 at Princeton Community Hospital in Princeton. Born May 27, 1922 at Wenonah, he was the son of the a late Theo M. Bones and Mary Sue Bailey Bones.

Mr. Bones was a graduate of Matoak High School and the West Virginia University College of Engineering in 1943. He was employed by General Electric Co. in New York as a Research Engineer. He designed antennas for the first test firings of rockets in White Sands, NM, a project of unprecedented proportions in 1949-50. He designed and installed the first TV “cable” on top of Wenonah mountain and operated H and B TV Co. Another hobby of Milton’s was photography and loved developing, printing and enlarging his own photographs. Some of his photos will be donated to the Mercer County Historical Society as they show the glory of Wenonah in all seasons. He was self-taught in translating English to German and enjoyed corresponding in that language. Milton wrote numerous programs for Texas Instruments. He became a world known Mathematician in recent years with computer friends. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Princeton.

Survivors include a brother, Robert Bones of Clemmons, NC; and a sister, Mary Catherine Bones of Winston-Salem, NC.

A graveside service will be conducted at 2:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 26 2010 at Roselawn Memorial Gardens in Princeton with the Rev. Randy Adkins officiating. Friends attending the service are asked to meet at the Bailey-Kirk Funeral Home by 1:45.
