PRINCETON – Raymond W. Testino, 85, of Edgewood, MD died Tuesday, August 23, 2011 at Stella Maris Hospice Care in Timonium, MD. Born December 18, 1925 in Matoaka, WV, Raymond was the son of the late Samuel Sullivan Testino and Bessie Caudle Testino.

Raymond was of the Protestant faith. He was a World War II Veteran of the U.S. Army. He owned and operated Faye's Café in Matoaka, better known as White Front Café. Before moving to MD, he worked in the mines for seven years. He retired from a steel mill in Baltimore, MD after 33 years. He was a lifetime member of Moose Lodge 537 in Edgemere, MD.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one son, C.J. Delp; four brothers, Joe, Paul, Charles and J.C. Testino and two sisters, Virginia Grewe and Dorothy DeBold.
